## BAPTISM

The sacrament of Baptism admits a candidate to the Christian church and is closely associated with Confirmation and the Eucharist. Baptism is the beginning of a long process: the initiation into Christ and His Church which takes place as your child grows into maturity.

The four main denominations agree that baptism is in two parts:

- A Baptism into the Church of Christ by the pouring of water in the name of the Trinity.
- **B** Reception into the local worshipping community

All require that the child should be baptised before (in front of) its local congregation. Some Roman Catholic dioceses will require a period of instruction for the parents prior to the child's baptism.

Each of the four main denominations recognise the validity of each other's baptism. While this is to be wholeheartedly welcomed, many couples wish to have a shared ceremony to reflect their married life

Among the SHARED options for mixed marriage couples may be the following:

- i) In a Protestant Church with a Roman Catholic priest assisting.
- **ii)** In a Roman Catholic Church with a Protestant minister assisting.
- iii) When the couple are both practising in their own denominations some may want the baptism to reflect their unity in the Primary Church, the home. Also the child's congregation is to be found not in either church but in both

Thus the baptism sometimes takes place in the home before a properly invited congregation with both clergy taking an active part.

iv) Concelebrated Baptism – when both clergy together say the words and pour the water – is unfortunately no longer officially permitted in any of the main denominations

### **Schooling**

To guarantee a place at a school of their choice parents often find that they need to make a decision about schooling within the first year of their child's life. This choice can mean that their child will be identified as Protestant or Roman Catholic.
